- Be advised that applications become the property of the selection committee and will not be returned to the applicant. The selection committee will notify those selected of its decision in writing by June 15th. No written notification will be sent to applicants except those selected.
- Submitting an application is in no way a guarantee that a scholarship will be granted. There is no appeal and the decision of the selection committee is final.
- Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.

Eligibility/Requirements

All applicants must:

- Be a Cranford resident
- Be a graduating high school senior. You may receive the scholarship one time only.
- **Submit applications that are postmarked no later than the midnight, March 25, 2010 deadline. Use sufficient postage.**
- Submit a high school transcript that includes:
 - Current GPA
 - SAT Scores – Ask your guidance department to send these to the Scholarship Committee Chairman. Chairperson.
- Provide two signed recommendation letters, as follows:
 - One letter of recommendation from a teacher, coach or club advisor.
 - A second letter of recommendation from someone outside the school systemNote: Letters of recommendation from guidance counselors or relatives will not be accepted.
- Enclose a stamped, self-addressed postcard that will be initialed, dated, and returned to let you know your application has been received.
